Nexus vs. CANPASS

Please be aware that a Nexus card holder does not carry the same privileges as a CANPASS permit holder. Nexus allows for expedited customs processing for air travel where iris scanners are available at a limited number of international airports, whereas CANPASS permit holders can land at a greater number of airports that are designated CANPASS only airports and are available 24 hours per day. A Nexus card cannot be used in place of a CANPASS permit but can be used in place of a passport for Canadian citizens re-entering Canada.
